Legacies at work – for those of you who are eagled-eyed you will have noticed that we have upgraded the sound system in the Narthex Hall. This system negates the need for the large bass speakers that were located on the ground. The system is also very simple to use, has Bluetooth capability and is not able to be adjusted by various users (through past experience systems that have numerous settings are always prone to complications). Over the next week we will also be equipping the hall with sound deadening panels which will help with the poor acoustics within this building as well as controlling the volume that is emitted when hosting events. As a parish we were unable to afford to do this ourselves. All of this has been accomplished with appreciation to a generous legacy that we received recently.

This legacy means that not only are we becoming better neighbours, due to being able to control the noise pollution from functions that are held within the hall, but it also means that our enhanced facilities should attract future bookings for conferences, functions and similar events. This means that this generous legacy has not only paid for these essential works but will provide potential income for our future too.

The legacy was so substantial that we will also be able to protect the Narthex staff and volunteers through the installation of a cooling system for the kitchen. Please consider the Cathedral when preparing your will. We thank you for your generosity.
