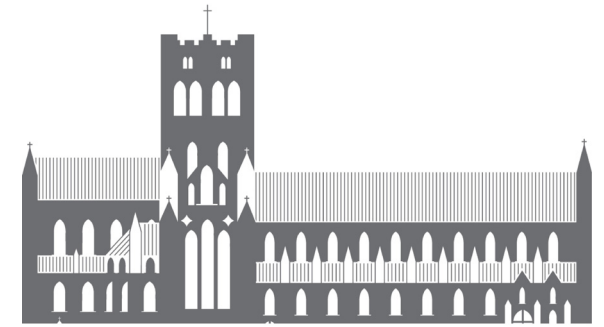

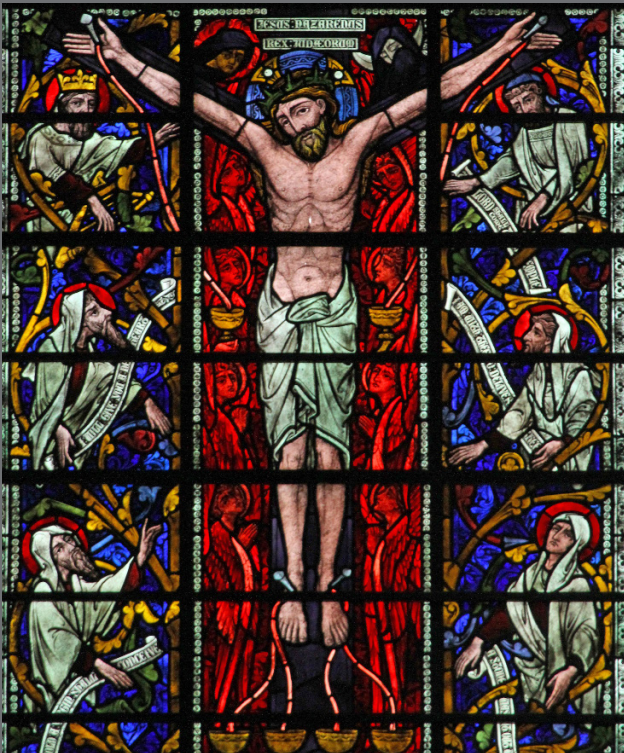

The Cathedral Church of St. John the Baptist in Norwich is the mother church of the Diocese of East Anglia. It is considered one of the finest Catholic cathedrals in the country. It was built in the Early English Gothic style as a gift to the Catholics of Norwich by Henry Fitzalan-Howard, 15th Duke of Norfolk.

Completed in 1910, it is acclaimed as one of the finest examples of Victorian Gothic Revivalist architecture in the country. The Cathedral is especially famous for its stunning stained glass windows.
