


Lent & Holy Week in the Cathedral of Saint John the Baptist, Norwich 2025

Lenten Talks

The History of Catholic England (Part One): From the Roman Empire to Henry VIII

In this first Lent talk, Dr Richard Maguire, will be looking at the history of Catholic England. Beginning with the arrival of the Catholic Church during the Roman period, he will explore the revival of the Church in the Anglo-Saxon kingdoms and the triumphs and challenges of the Medieval Period. The talk will use the images of Catholic history in the Cathedral's stainedglass, as well as the Cathedral's architecture to help us think about this story.

The History of Catholic England (Part Two): From the Break with Rome to the Early 20th Century

In the second of his Lent talks, Dr Richard Maguire will once again use the stained-glass and the architecture of the Cathedral to explore the decision by Henry VIII to break with Rome and the disastrous impact it had on Catholic England. The talk will explore the 'penal years' from 1534 to 1829 and finish with the nineteenth/early twentieth century revival of Catholicism in England, the period when the (then) Church of Saint John the Baptist was founded.

Gregorian Chant and the Liturgy


