A message from Fr Alan...

Pentecost Sunday: Next Sunday, as we celebrate the great Solemnity of Pentecost, bishop Peter will confirm just over 60 of our young parishioners into the Faith. He will preside at the 11:00 Mass at the cathedral and at an additional Mass at 3pm (we put on this extra Mass simply because of the great numbers of confirmands).

How blessed we are to have such a terrific number of people stepping forward to witness to the mission of Christ. This, after all, is what Easter, the Ascension and Pentecost is all about - going out into the world to make disciples of all nations.

I thank Jo Graham and all of the catechists, the Ignite Team and the assistants for the dedication, time and skills they utilise in order to engage and include this group in learning about the Church and about our Lord Jesus Christ.

Please keep all of the Confirmation candidates in your prayers over this next week (I know that many of you have been praying for them by name - thank you). Please spare a prayer for all those mentioned above who have helped them to prepare for this most wonderful sacrament.

This needs to be said: I want to give you a bit of an insight into the preparation that goes into celebrating a Mass at the cathedral: The polishers come in twice a week to keep our silverware and brass looking immaculate (a mammoth task), the cleaners come in every Tuesday and spend hours vacuuming and sweeping the floors. The flower group spend hours of their own time, bring flowers from home and hone their talents to help make the cathedral look beautiful. The servers travel in from all directions, are trained by Stephen and work hard to bring dignity and grace to the Mass. The sacristans arrive at least an hour before to get the vestments and the numerous objects ready for Mass so that the service runs swiftly and they are assisted by a group of volunteers who wash the altar linens - keeping them spotless. The readers hone their skills by practicing the readings of the day and researching the context so that they can read with skill and knowledge and the priest spends time researching and committing his homily to memory so that it, too, makes sense and is relevant and to the point....

....And then somebody's mobile phone rings!

All of that work is wasted and pointless because the mobile phone breaks the mood, distracts the WHOLE cathedral and spoils the moment. The worst is that some people then either answer it; "I am at Mass, I can't talk now", they whisper.... or they make a 100-yard dash to get out of the cathedral to answer it!

This seems to be happening with greater regularity at all Masses (cathedral and Holy Apostles), weekdays and Sundays. Please, turn your phones off!

Please take action against the Abortion up to birth amendment. Labour MP, Tonia Antoniazzi, has tabled a new extreme abortion up to birth amendment ahead of Report Stage of the Crime and Policing Bill. The amendment would change the law so it would no longer be illegal to perform "own abortions" for any reason, and **at any point up to and during birth**. The change to the law would apply throughout the entire pregnancy and **would not exclude sex-selective abortions**. This would likely lead to a tragic rise in the number of babies' lives being ended through late-term abortions carried out at home. **TAKE ACTION**. INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGULAR SACRAMENTS

With all sacraments, we do try to accommodate the needs of the individual or couple seeking to celebrate in our Cathedral. However, we are bound by the Rite of the Catholic Church in terms of liturgy and music. The priest or deacon assigned to work with you will guide you as much as possible. In general, eulogies are NOT part of the Catholic rite of Funerals and, as such should be deferred to the crematorium or a suitable gathering of loved ones after the funeral.

Our Director of Music will assist you with appropriate music that matches the dignity of the service and is appropriate to the Cathedral - this will be from a choice of sacred music generally played on the cathedral organ (no pre-recorded music).

All readings in the Cathedral must come from Sacred Scripture - poems and prose that do not comply with this should be used at the reception after the service.

BAPTISMS

Infant Baptisms - baptism is the joy-filled initiation into the Christian life and is celebrated as a public event within the community. The Sacrament of Baptism takes place on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of the month at 11:30am. This is a joint celebration with up to three other families. Baptism preparation classes are held on the last Saturday of every month from 4.30pm - 5.15pm. This needs to be booked, in advance, through the parish office.

Adult Baptisms - generally take place at the Easter Vigil and conferred by the Bishop in his Cathedral. Candidates will need to undergo adult instruction classes for at least five months (usually starting in late September). Classes take place every Friday evening from 7pm - commencing in September.

Baptisms do not take place during the seasons of Advent and Lent. For all Baptism enquiries, please contact the parish office.

WEDDINGS

A minimum of 6 months' notice is required of any marriage taking place in the cathedral. Wedding couples should be resident within the parish boundaries or have some strong link to the cathedral. Please **do not** make any arrangements nor book any venue or make any concrete plans until you have secured a wedding date.

There is a three-fold requirement for marriage preparation; Catechetical and Liturgical preparation (a marriage instruction course at the cathedral toward the middle of January as well as a one-day course in Newmarket), Civil paperwork (through the townhall) as well as documentation required by the Catholic Church for the chancery and parish registers. This applies whether you are planning to be married in the Cathedral or if you plan to marry in a different location.

FUNERALS

At St John's Cathedral, funerals take place during the weekday 10am Mass. The Cathedral is generally booked through your funeral director - so please speak to them first about your needs and they will contact the Cathedral on your behalf.
