## A message from Fr Alan...

**Ordinary Time:** It is as if, as a Church, we can all take a collective sigh as the we enter into 'Ordinary Time' in the Church's calendar - after the 49 days of Lent as we anticipated the passion, death and resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ and then the 50 days of joy as we celebrated this great feast with great dignity and happiness. Of course, the 99 days of these two seasons were dominated with the news of the Holy Father's health (during Lent) and then the excitement of conclave and the election of Pope Leo as the 267<sup>th</sup> pontiff (during Easter time). It is unusual for the whole world to be so gripped and supportive of us as a Church for something so Catholic.

Ordinary time, as refreshing as it is with her beautiful green vestments and a slightly toned-down liturgy, is by no means a time of quiet or rest - certainly not at the cathedral at any rate. Next Saturday (14th of June) we have the Mass for the celebration of Marriage and Family Life at 11:30 where many married couples from the diocese are welcomed into the cathedral to celebrate the sacrament of marriage with all her challenges, joys and commitment of love and stability. The very next day, Sunday the 15th June, is the feast of the Most Holy Trinity where we celebrate the triune love of the three persons of God (three persons, one God). The following Sunday (22nd of June) we have the Feast of Corpus Christi where we process with the Blessed Sacrament after the 11:00 Mass and celebrate the miracle of the Eucharist. Finally, for June at least, on Thursday the 26<sup>th</sup> of June at 12:00 we celebrate the feast of the Dedication of this Cathedral and Bishop Peter will be inducting two new Cathedral Canons.

So, although we can breathe a small sigh of relief in anticipation of Ordinary Time, we do have plenty to celebrate and enjoy over the weeks ahead.

Corpus Christi marks the beginning of a 'mini season' within the cathedral as the First Holy Communion children all come forward to receive the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist. At virtually every weekend Mass, for three weeks, we welcome these children as they complete another stage of the sacraments of Initiation. Let us pray for these children and for their parents - especially, that the parents will help these children to fulfil their obligation and attend Mass on Sunday (every Sunday).

**Hamish MacQueen:** A couple of weeks ago, I promoted Hamish's evening of music at the cathedral where he will entertain us through his music (he writes it himself) as well as his life of faith in serving the Lord through music and as Director of Youth Services for the diocese. His musical evening, with special guests, will take place at 7:30pm on the 19<sup>th</sup> of July. I admire the youth of this cathedral because, rather than taking the easy route and having a 2<sup>nd</sup> collection if they need something, they band together and host cake sales, bingo nights and musical evenings. ## **READINGS AT MASS** First reading

## Sunday 8th June 2025 Acts 2:1-11

#### 'They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.'

When the day of Pentecost arrived, the Apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians — we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.'

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in one Spirit, we were all baptised into one body — Jews or Greeks, slaves or free — and all were made to drink of one Spirit.

**Please take action against the Abortion up to birth amendment**. Labour MP, Tonia Antoniazzi, has tabled a new extreme abortion up to birth amendment ahead of Report Stage of the Crime and Policing Bill. The amendment would change the law so it would no longer be illegal to perform "own abortions" for any reason, and **at any point up to and during birth**. The change to the law would apply throughout the entire pregnancy and **would not exclude sex-selective abortions**. This would likely lead to a tragic rise in the number of babies' lives being ended through late-term abortions carried out at home. **TAKE ACTION.** Right to Life UK have launched a *No to Abortion Up to Birth* campaign, focused entirely on stopping this attempt to hijack the Crime and Policing Bill. ## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGULAR SACRAMENTS**

With all sacraments, we do try to accommodate the needs of the individual or couple seeking to celebrate in our Cathedral. However, we are bound by the Rite of the Catholic Church in terms of liturgy and music. The priest or deacon assigned to work with you will guide you as much as possible. In general, eulogies are NOT part of the Catholic rite of Funerals and, as such should be deferred to the crematorium or a suitable gathering of loved ones after the funeral.

Our Director of Music will assist you with appropriate music that matches the dignity of the service and is appropriate to the Cathedral - this will be from a choice of sacred music generally played on the cathedral organ (no pre-recorded music).

All readings in the Cathedral must come from Sacred Scripture - poems and prose that do not comply with this should be used at the reception after the service.

#### BAPTISMS

**Infant Baptisms** - baptism is the joy-filled initiation into the Christian life and is celebrated as a public event within the community. The Sacrament of Baptism takes place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month at 11:30am. This is a joint celebration with up to three other families. Baptism preparation classes are held on the last Saturday of every month from 4.30pm - 5.15pm. This needs to be booked, in advance, through the parish office.

**Adult Baptisms** - generally take place at the Easter Vigil and conferred by the Bishop in his Cathedral. Candidates will need to undergo adult instruction classes for at least five months (usually starting in late September). Classes take place every Friday evening from 7pm - commencing in September.

Baptisms do not take place during the seasons of Advent and Lent. For all Baptism enquiries, please contact the parish office.

#### WEDDINGS

A minimum of 6 months' notice is required of any marriage taking place in the cathedral. Wedding couples should be resident within the parish boundaries or have some strong link to the cathedral. Please **do not** make any arrangements nor book any venue or make any concrete plans until you have secured a wedding date.

There is a three-fold requirement for marriage preparation; Catechetical and Liturgical preparation (a marriage instruction course at the cathedral toward the middle of January as well as a one-day course in Newmarket), Civil paperwork (through the townhall) as well as documentation required by the Catholic Church for the chancery and parish registers. This applies whether you are planning to be married in the Cathedral or if you plan to marry in a different location.

#### FUNERALS

At St John's Cathedral, funerals take place during the weekday 10am Mass. The Cathedral is generally booked through your funeral director - so please speak to them first about your needs and they will contact the Cathedral on your behalf.
