# A message from Fr Alan...

**Two important votes:** This week on Wednesday in our parliament, the MPs voted in favour of legalising abortion of our children right up to the time of birth (full term). This has shocked many people and should shock and dismay ALL Catholics as it flies so sharply in the face of Church teaching. We are called to protect the most vulnerable in our society and to ensure that they are protected at all costs.

In March 1995, Pope Saint John Paul II wrote the encyclical Evangelium Vitae where he talks about the sanctity of human life and covers Abortion, Euthanasia and Capital Punishment; he said the following - The acceptance of abortion in the popular mind, in behaviour and even in law itself, is a telling sign of an extremely dangerous crisis of the moral sense, which is becoming more and more incapable of distinguishing between good and evil. (Evangelium Vitae, no. 58)

When the Abortion Act was passed in the UK in 1967, it had many safeguards, checks and balances and (two doctors and at least one legal criterion). Barely 40 years later these safeguards have been dropped and the ones who suffer are the most vulnerable. Later today (Friday) the so called 'Assisted Dying' bill will reach its third vote in Parliament - also with many 'safeguards and limitations'. How long will these safeguards remain, should this evil act be passed?

Corpus Christi: This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of Corpus Christi where, after the 11:00 Mass we process with the Blessed Sacrament and celebrate the true presence (body, blood, soul and divinity) of Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Blessed Sacrament. One of the most joyful and powerful celebrations of the year. We begin our time of First Holy Communion Masses this week as just over 120 children receive the Blessed Sacrament for the first time - this will happen over a variety of Masses throughout June. Congratulations to our children and thank you, as always, to our catechists.

**Two new Canons:** On Thursday, 26 June, we will celebrate the Feast of the Dedication of the Cathedral, and Bishop Peter will induct two new canons into the ranks of Cathedral Canons. Fr Sean Connolly (Vicar General) and Fr David Finnegan (Vicar for Clergy Welfare) will join the ranks of the Chapter of Canons this year. There will be no 10:00 Mass on Thursday as the Mass will be celebrated at 12:00 - all are welcome to attend. I wish Canons David and Sean every blessing in their new role and their new ministry. *Ad multos annos!*

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGULAR SACRAMENTS

With all sacraments, we do try to accommodate the needs of the individual or couple seeking to celebrate in our Cathedral. However, we are bound by the Rite of the Catholic Church in terms of liturgy and music. The priest or deacon assigned to work with you will guide you as much as possible. In general, eulogies are NOT part of the Catholic rite of Funerals and, as such should be deferred to the crematorium or a suitable gathering of loved ones after the funeral.

Our Director of Music will assist you with appropriate music that matches the dignity of the service and is appropriate to the Cathedral - this will be from a choice of sacred music generally played on the cathedral organ (no pre-recorded music).

All readings in the Cathedral must come from Sacred Scripture - poems and prose that do not comply with this should be used at the reception after the service.

#### **BAPTISMS**

**Infant Baptisms** - baptism is the joy-filled initiation into the Christian life and is celebrated as a public event within the community. The Sacrament of Baptism takes place on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Saturday of the month at 11:30am. This is a joint celebration with up to three other families. Baptism preparation classes are held on the last Saturday of every month from 4.30pm - 5.15pm. This needs to be booked, in advance, through the parish office.

**Adult Baptisms** - generally take place at the Easter Vigil and conferred by the Bishop in his Cathedral. Candidates will need to undergo adult instruction classes for at least five months (usually starting in late September). Classes take place every Friday evening from 7pm - commencing in September.

Baptisms do not take place during the seasons of Advent and Lent. For all Baptism enquiries, please contact the parish office.

#### **WEDDINGS**

A minimum of 6 months' notice is required of any marriage taking place in the cathedral. Wedding couples should be resident within the parish boundaries or have some strong link to the cathedral. Please **do not** make any arrangements nor book any venue or make any concrete plans until you have secured a wedding date.

There is a three-fold requirement for marriage preparation; Catechetical and Liturgical preparation (a marriage instruction course at the cathedral toward the middle of January as well as a one-day course in Newmarket), Civil paperwork (through the townhall) as well as documentation required by the Catholic Church for the chancery and parish registers. This applies whether you are planning to be married in the Cathedral or if you plan to marry in a different location.

#### **FUNERALS**

At St John's Cathedral, funerals take place during the weekday 10am Mass. The Cathedral is generally booked through your funeral director - so please speak to them first about your needs and they will contact the Cathedral on your behalf.
