Haymarket Wednesday Afternoon "Soup run" - For the past two years the Norwich Justice & Peace Group, friends and family have supported Cromer SVP and Norwich Franciscan groups by taking a turn every four weeks to provide soup, hot drinks, sandwiches and treats to rough sleepers and other needy folk. We need to recruit more volunteers to establish a second team, so that we can increase our support to every two weeks. In addition to making sandwiches, we need volunteers to make soup and drinks and serve them and the sandwiches and treats outside the former Debenhams store in Brigg St. It takes two hours (3-5pm) commencing at 3pm with preparation of soup and hot drinks at a location with parking near the city centre. We find it an enjoyable and satisfying task and you will be shown the ropes. In particular we need someone who has a car and would be confident driving from the location to Brigg Street and assembling the two small tables that we use.
