# A message from Fr Alan...

Rome Pilgrimage: As you are probably aware, I went on pilgrimage to Rome last week for the Jubilee Year and I accompanied the knights and dames of the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem. Like all pilgrimages, it had its moments of chaos (transport and trying to filter 3400 knights and dames through one holy door in four separate basillicae) and there were moments of great devotion and prayer - sitting in the holy churches waiting for Mass, the Mass itself, talking to pilgrims and simply watching these devoted men and women completing their spiritual exercises. It was a very humbling and moving experience. We had an audience with the Holy Father who was received by the pilgrims with great enthusiasm and joy and, for me at least, the privilege of concelebrating Mass in three of the Papal Basilicae was very moving.

Present in all of our minds during our pilgrimage was, of course, the situation in Gaza and the Middle East and I know that heaven was stormed with prayers for the holy places and the living stones of these lands. Let us continue to pray for long lasting peace and a firm resolution to maintain peace and harmony between all parties.

Confirmation Retreat: After the pilgrimage, I had to hit the deck running as our confirmation candidates went on retreat this week - 74 of our young people, all preparing for Confirmation, went away together for five days to learn more about their faith, themselves and each other. These retreats are always well received and, hopefully, a period of Grace and growth for the candidates. Fr Jinu, Fr Anthony, Fr Denys and I each said Mass for them on different days either at the cathedral on the first and last days or at the site itself and we also spent time listening to Confessions. My thanks really goes out to our catechists, the Ignite Team (they all spend the whole week onsite) as well as the group of volunteers who go through to help with the cooking and washing up. It is a real team effort and takes immense planning months in advance to ensure a successful retreat. Thank you to everyone who helps and plans the retreat as a parish, we are truly grateful.

**Windows**' **appeal:** My heartfelt thanks to the initial generosity towards the repair of the windows in the sunken chapel - we still have a long way to go in terms of repairing the window to Flora (the most critical window) but, I am confident that we will get there. I had a small glimmer of good news in that initially the estimate was thought to be in the region of £26k, but the final quote is actually £20 200 (+vat). So, a bit of good news. I will try and keep you updated about the finances for this project as we go along, so far, we have raised £3,937.50. Thank you for your generosity - let's get this project sorted!

Network Norfolk Christian Communications Award (NNCCA): Last week we hosted the NNCCA ceremony in the Narthex where many Christian communities gathered for an awards ceremony in a variety of categories. Charley Purves and her team in the Narthex with our web designers Integrated Ideas Agency were named as the winners for the Best Church Website. This is great news for our cathedral in this city, and I must agree that our website looks fresh, inviting and is easy to navigate. There are some brilliant photographs, and it is regularly updated and kept current by the team under Charley's encouragement. We also, as a diocese, were highly commended for a picture displaying the Church in Action. The photo was from the Maundy Thursday Mass in our cathedral with Bishop Peter washing the feet of parishioners.

# **READINGS AT MASS**

First reading

# Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2025 Revelation 7:2-4, 9-14

# 'Behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages.'

I, John, saw another angel ascending from the rising of the sun, with the seal of the living God, and he called with a loud voice to the four angels who had been given power to harm earth and sea, saying, 'Do not harm the earth or the sea or the trees, until we have sealed the servants of our God on their foreheads.' And I heard the number of the sealed, one hundred and forty-four thousand, sealed from every tribe of the sons of Israel.

**Prayer and Adoration for Life – Holy Hour – November 5**<sup>th</sup> - as the House of Lords are currently scrutinizing the Assisted suicide bill and the second reading of the Antoniazzi abortion up to birth amendment is happening soon, we continue our prayers for the protection of life at both the end of life and from its conception. There will be a Holy Hour for Life on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> November taking place 5-6pm. All are welcome.

**Deanery Requiem Mass** - The annual **Requiem Mass** for the deceased clergy of the Norwich deanery will be celebrated on **Wednesday 5th November at the Cathedral, at 11am**. Parishioners from across the Deanery are invited to attend this Mass, as we pray for the many priests and deacons who have served our parishes in the past.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGULAR SACRAMENTS

With all sacraments, we do try to accommodate the needs of the individual or couple seeking to celebrate in our Cathedral. However, we are bound by the Rite of the Catholic Church in terms of liturgy and music. The priest or deacon assigned to work with you will guide you as much as possible. In general, eulogies are NOT part of the Catholic rite of Funerals and, as such should be deferred to the crematorium or a suitable gathering of loved ones after the funeral.

Our Director of Music will assist you with appropriate music that matches the dignity of the service and is appropriate to the Cathedral - this will be from a choice of sacred music generally played on the cathedral organ (no pre-recorded music).

All readings in the Cathedral must come from Sacred Scripture - poems and prose that do not comply with this should be used at the reception after the service.

#### **BAPTISMS**

**Infant Baptisms** - baptism is the joy-filled initiation into the Christian life and is celebrated as a public event within the community. The Sacrament of Baptism takes place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month at 11:30am. This is a joint celebration with up to three other families. Baptism preparation classes are held on the last Saturday of every month from 4.30pm - 5.15pm. This needs to be booked, in advance, through the parish office.

**Adult Baptisms** - generally take place at the Easter Vigil and conferred by the Bishop in his Cathedral. Candidates will need to undergo adult instruction classes for at least five months (usually starting in late September). Classes take place every Friday evening from 7pm - commencing in September.

Baptisms do not take place during the seasons of Advent and Lent. For all Baptism enquiries, please contact the parish office.

#### WEDDINGS

A minimum of 6 months' notice is required of any marriage taking place in the cathedral. Wedding couples should be resident within the parish boundaries or have some strong link to the cathedral. Please **do not** make any arrangements nor book any venue or make any concrete plans until you have secured a wedding date.

There is a three-fold requirement for marriage preparation; Catechetical and Liturgical preparation (a marriage instruction course at the cathedral toward the middle of January as well as a one-day course in Newmarket), Civil paperwork (through the townhall) as well as documentation required by the Catholic Church for the chancery and parish registers. This applies whether you are planning to be married in the Cathedral or if you plan to marry in a different location.

#### **FUNERALS**

At St John's Cathedral, funerals take place during the weekday 10am Mass. The Cathedral is generally booked through your funeral director - so please speak to them first about your needs and they will contact the Cathedral on your behalf.
